

Fun Informational Writing Cards

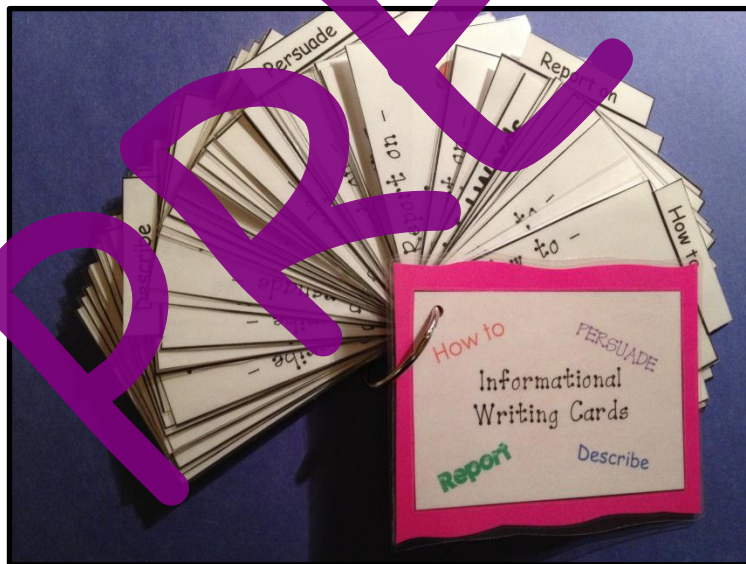
Great for Language Building *tool!*

The writing cards allow students to practice **informational** writing. There are **60+ Writing Cards**. The cards will aide students in choosing informational writing tasks and understanding each of the writing formats.

How to, Report on, Describe and Persuade

are included. Teachers should introduce one type of writing at a time and show students how the graphic helps you to recognize what the writing task requires. *Also included are extra cards with the title words so that you may add your own ideas and cards with key words or thoughts to aid children in the process of the type of writing required.*



These cards can be used during **Writer's Workshop**, **Center Time**, with the **Daily 5**, for **Nonfiction Writing Lessons** or as a way to assist children in thinking of informational topics.
